What Does the Lord Require of Us?

Micah 6:8 (LSB)

“He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does Yahweh require of you but to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?”

Reflection

Micah 6:8 is a powerful reminder that God is not looking for empty religious rituals. He desires hearts that live out His truth in everyday life. Justice reflects God’s fairness and righteousness. Mercy mirrors His compassion and forgiveness. Walking humbly keeps us dependent on Him rather than our own strength. This verse sums up the Christian Walk in three clear actions: live rightly, love deeply, and stay close to the Lord.

Questions for Reflection

1. Which of these three; justice, mercy, humility comes most naturally to you?
Which is the hardest?

2. How can your daily choices better reflect God’s justice?

3. Is there someone you need to show mercy to this week?

4. What does “walking humbly” look like in your personal relationship with God?

Encouragement

When we choose to live by Micah 6:8, we align ourselves with God's heart. These three actions aren't complicated, but they do require intentionality. You don't need a platform, a title, or a long list of accomplishments, just a willing heart and a desire to live for Him. God promises to guide, strengthen, and bless those who walk in His ways.

Lord, thank You for showing me what is good and what You require. Help me to live out Your justice, extend mercy to others, and walk humbly before You. Remove pride from my heart and fill me with Your compassion. Let my life reflect Your love and truth each day. In Jesus' name, Amen.
